Be it resolved that the Legislative Assembly

- (a) support the Government's ongoing commitments to
 - i) review Alberta's water management strategy to increase the availability of water and water licences,
 - ii) evaluate potential long-term infrastructure investments to ensure the sustainable management and safeguarding of water resources for the benefit of all Albertans, and

(b) urge the Government to expand these commitments by undertaking a comprehensive and updated assessment of water resources in the province, including the consideration of inter-basin water transfer as a means of optimizing the use of existing water resources.
